CHRISTMAS CAROL SERVICE

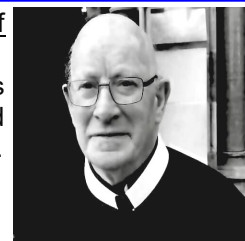
The Christmas Carol Service will take place next

Fr Gerry Cassidy was born in 1940, the second child in a family of two girls and six boys.

He received the names Michael Gerard at baptism but, because his father was called Michael, he was always known and called Gerard by his family. He left school at 14 and trained as a motor mechanic. In 1962 he went to Brazil and worked there with the Redemptorists for three and a half years. And then returned to Ireland and entered the Formation programme. Professed as a Redemptorist in 1967 and ordained on the 1st July 1973.



He didn't ever return to Brazil: ministered for almost 50 years in Ireland – all but 8 of them on the northern side of the border. [Esker for three years/Dundalk for four years.] After three years at St Clement's [1974 – 1977] – where he and Fr Sean Keeney did Youth Ministry together – Fr Gerry moved to Clonard and spent thirteen years as a member of the Clonard Community. During those years he worked with Fr Gerry Reynolds in ecumenical ministry and, in 1984, he joined the staff of Corrymeela as a Christian Education Worker.

The Rev Alex Wimberly– Leader of the Corrymeela Community – posted a message the day after Fr Gerry died: “...***we give thanks for the life of Fr Gerry. And we give thanks for this gentle servant, this washer of feet***” – a reference to Jesus washing the feet of his disciples.

It was at St Gerard's, doing all the bits and pieces of parish ministry that he came into his own. He served two terms there as Parish Priest: 1993 – 2002/2008-2019. It was at St Gerard's he was most at home. It's where he really flourished.

His ministry there was very much a ministry of presence: he was there for the people of the parish – baptising their children; visiting the schools; marrying couples; attending the sick and the house-bound; celebrating so many funerals.

The people felt his closeness to them. They appreciated his gentleness; his sincerity; his availability. They loved him! And he loved them!

Father Gerry returned to Clonard in 2019.

He was basically – in the very best sense of the word – a simple person. He certainly had a mind of his own! But I think there weren't any angles to him. He was easy to live with: pleasant, friendly, good-humoured, undemanding. His smile lit up his face! He loved to play a game of Scrabble; he spent hours doing a jigsaw; he enjoyed his food; he listened to Classic FM. He loved to be with his friends.

And, of course, he was also a great walker: for a number of years he travelled to Spain to walk the Camino.

To the end, Fr Gerry was deeply prayerful. May he rest eternally in God's peace.
