## Redemptorist Safeguarding Sunday (26 March 2023)

Redemptorist churches in Ireland mark the Fifth Sunday of Lent as Child Safeguarding Sunday.

Safeguarding Sunday seeks to acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children and vulnerable adults, including by priests, religious and lay people within Church contexts.

It makes a commitment to practices and protocols that create and maintain safe environments for all people. And it invites people to pray for those harmed by abuse directly and indirectly.

Safeguarding Sunday also invites us to thank God and the people responsible for the enormous work that has been and continues to be done to ensure that children are safe in Church settings. We need to keep working to ensure that they continue to do so. **PRAYER** 

Gracious God, you love and care for all of your children, especially the smallest and most vulnerable. We entrust to you the lives of children and adults at risk who have been sexually abused, and whose trust and innocence have been destroyed. Help us to hear the cry of their pain and to take responsibility for those whose lives have

<u>Divine Healing Ministries Special 30th Anniversary Service</u> at 7.30pm on Monday 27th March at St. Anne's Cathedral., Belfast. Divine Healing Ministries was founded by Church of Ireland clergyman Br. David Jardine along with Sr. Margaret McStay, a Cross and Passion Sister.

The first interdenominational healings service led by Br David Jardine began in the Cathedral in 1993. During the worst years of The Troubles, the healing services were attended by Catholics and Protestants and included testimonies of healing and of reconciliation. Brother David has noted that: "During that time enormous healing has taken place in body, mind and spirit."

There will be a time of worship, testimonies of healing and the Speaker at this special service will be Fr. Pat Collins CM from Dublin.
