# This Sunday's Scripture Readings

Acts 14:21-27 Paul situates Jesus as the goal of the history of God's people Revelation 21:1-5 The vision of a new world, portrayed as the new, heavenly Jerusalem

John 13:31-35 Jesus gives the new commandment, to love one another

#### Reflection, John 13:31-35

"Love One Another"

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us a new commandment that is both simple and profound: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. "These words were spoken not in comfort, but in the shadow of betrayal. And yet, Jesus chooses love.

This is not a sentimental love. It is a love that kneels to wash feet, that forgives enemies, that sacrifices self for others. It is a love that costs something.

In our modern world, love is often confused with convenience or fleeting emotion. But Jesus calls us to a deeper, more radical love—a love that shows up when it's hard, when it's inconvenient, when it means putting others first.

Imagine if our homes, workplaces, and communities were marked by this kind of love. What if we forgave more quickly, listened more deeply, and served more humbly? That is how the world will know we are His disciples—not by our words, but by our love. Today, let us ask: Who in my life needs to see Christ's love through me? May we not just speak of love, but live it—boldly, generously, and unconditionally. A love that is self-less, compassionate, and given without expectation of return.
