

FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

Matthew 16:13-19

"You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church."



In today's Gospel, Jesus asks a question that echoes through every age:

"Who do you say I am?" Peter's bold answer "You are the Christ the Son of the living God" — this becomes the foundation of the Church. But Peter wasn't perfect. He doubted, denied, and stumbled. Yet Jesus still chose him.

On this feast of Saints Peter and Paul, we celebrate two very different men united by one mission: to proclaim Christ. Peter, the fisherman who often spoke before thinking. Paul, the scholar who once persecuted Christians. God used both—flaws and all—to build His Church.

This is deeply relevant today. We often feel unworthy, too broken or too ordinary to make a difference. But God doesn't call the perfect—He perfects the called. Like Peter and Paul, we are invited to say "yes" to Christ, to be bold in faith, and to trust that God can work through us.

Let's ask: Who do I say Jesus is in my life?

Is He your Savior, your Teacher, your Friend, your Healer? Is He the one you turn to in crisis, or the one you walk with daily? Your answer shapes not just your beliefs, but your choices, relationships, and life.

And how can I live that answer today?

You don't have to be perfect—just willing. Like Peter and Paul, your "yes" to Jesus can transform your life and touch others too.
