## REFLECTION: Luke 12:13-21 The Rich Fool, a warning against greed and selfishness

In today's world, success is often measured by what we own; our homes, our careers, our bank balance, and our status. But in today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of a rich man who stores up wealth, only to die that very night. His mistake wasn't being rich it was being rich only for himself, not "rich towards God."

This passage isn't just a tale about a farmer; it is a mirror reflecting our own society's relentless pursuit of "more." It is challenging us to rethink what truly matters. Are we investing in things that last like compassion, generosity, relationships, faith? Or are we building 'bigger barns' for our own comfort while others go without?

In a society driven by consumerism and self-interest, Jesus invites us to live differently. To see our possessions not as trophies, but as tools for love. To ask not "What can I gain?" but "What can I give?"

This week, take a moment to reflect; What am I storing up? And who benefits from it? Let's detach from the allure of endless acquisition. Let's be bold enough to live generously, trusting that in giving, we receive far more than we could ever hoard. So, for <a href="this weeks challenge">this weeks challenge</a>, find a way to be "rich toward God". Perhaps give more generously, spend quality time with loved ones, or simply take a moment to appreciate the non-material blessings we have in our lives. Let's strive to be truly rich in faith, rich in love, and rich toward God.
