Year with Mass at 3.00pm in St Peter's Cathedral, Belfast

on Sunday 4th January 2026.

He would like to invite as many as possible, from across the Diocese, to join him for the <u>Mass</u> and some <u>refreshments</u> afterwards in **St Comgall's Centre**.

While the Jubilee Year of Hope will formally close, the task ahead will be to carry it's Message of Hope with us into the New Year 2026.

In <u>Rome</u> the Jubilee Year will conclude with the <u>closing of the Holy Door</u> of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican by <u>Pope Leo XIV</u> on the <u>Solemnity of the Epiphany</u>, <u>January 6</u>, 2026.
