REFLECTION MATTHEW 4:12-23 WALKING THE SHORELINE OF THE EVERYDAY

In this week's Gospel, we see Jesus moving from the shadows of John's arrest into the bright, busy reality of Galilee. He doesn't retreat into a desert or hide in a temple; he goes right to the shoreline where people are pursuing their busy days lives and just trying to make a living.

When He calls Peter, Andrew, James, and John, He doesn't wait until they have tidied up their lives or figured out a spiritual plan. He meets them in the middle of their workday and simply says, "*Follow me*" and they do.

Between the stress of deadlines and the clutter of my daily life, I often find myself more tethered to my worries than to my faith. This Gospel invites us to hear Jesus' call - quiet but persistent in our everyday lives. Jesus steps into our workplaces, our family responsibilities, our anxieties, our cluttered schedules and his message is "*Repent*," this isn't a scolding it's an invitation to turn toward light, possibility, and hope.

I may not always be ready or worthy, but Jesus still calls. And maybe following Him begins not with dramatic changes, but by saying "*yes*" to being guided, one imperfect step at a time.

So, let's try to see our routine not as a distraction from God, but as the very place He is standing. Let's listen for the "*Call*" - where is Jesus asking us to leave behind a grudge or a worry today? Our "*Yes*" response - maybe this is just a kind word to someone or a moment of silent prayer in our busy life. The bottom line is we aren't called because we are *ready*, we are *made ready* because we say yes.
